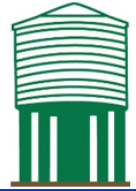

Updated Parks Master Plan

The Parks Commission spent 2019 working on an update to the Parks Master Plan, which guides park development through the year 2040. Several new community scale parks are included in the Plan, including a new sports complex south of Carver, a splash pad downtown, and redevelopment of City property into a dog park, brush site, and Frisbee golf course at the intersection of County Road 40 and Jonathan Carver Parkway. The graphics show the vision of the Parks Commission and the work they have put into this Plan. This Plan details the ultimate buildout of the parks system by 2040. The City is not currently reviewing these projects for construction, but the Parks Commission will be tasked with guiding development of the proposed parks for the next several years and will use the Parks Master Plan as their guiding document.

Development of new parks in Carver is funded by park dedication, which is a fee that is collected at the time of building permit and an annual contribution from the City’s general fund. 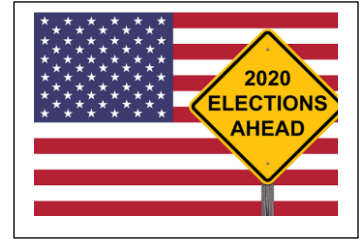

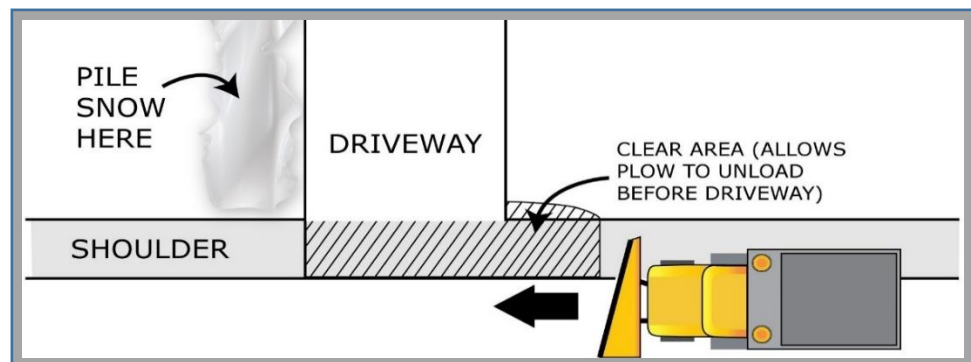


Snow Shoveling Tips

There is probably nothing more frustrating than shoveling out the driveway, and then along comes a snowplow that pushes a big pile of snow right back in front of the driveway. The following tip for shoveling your driveway will help to avoid being plowed in.

The City of Carver suggests that you clear an area to the right of your driveway (as seen in the diagram below) to give the snow on the blade of the plow a place to empty before it gets to your driveway. By piling the snow away from the oncoming direction of the snowplows, the snow will not be pushed back onto the driveway.

Eliminate snow piles at the property entrance whenever possible. High accumulations of snow can obstruct the vision of motorists, posing a safety hazard.



The City reminds you that it is hazardous to push snow from a sidewalk or driveway onto any roadway as this creates an unsafe condition for all vehicles.
